Subject Late Receipt of Application for Vessel Clearance by MOD and Block

Sir,

In reference of above subject, it has been communicated by MOD with concern that a large number of applications for MOD clearance are submitted VERY LATE not giving them time for proper scrutiny and process as defined, to be followed by them for same.

This may result in grave omissions/mistakes at their end.

As per the existing guidelines by MoD (Ministry of Defence) following minimum time is required for processing of applications by MOD.

- a) For Vessels:
 - Minimum 30 working days for Fresh Cases
 - Minimum 10 working days for 'Continued Operation' Cases.
- b) Data clearance for processing abroad-Minimum 30 working days.

MoD has taken a strong note of delay in submission of applications and has informed, in future they will not entertain such cases, if time frame as prescribed is not adhered.

You are also advised to add 03 working days for processing at DGH. This is for your information and to strictly follow time frame as indicated in this letter for
